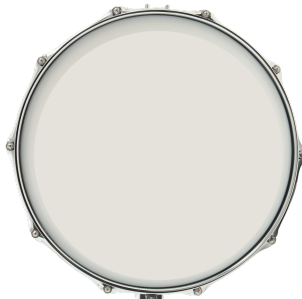

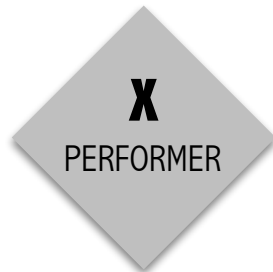
How to Set-Up:

- Make sure your snare strainer is lined up directly in front of you for best sound when playing on the edge.
- Set up a trap stand or music stand so that it is flat with a towel on it next to the snare drum.
- Have tambourine resting near the edge of the stand so that you may pick it up with minimal sound.

Snare Drum Solo Performance Tips:

- Make sure you are set up for all three musical etudes/solos. (see above)
- Pay attention to the tempo marking.
- Play with concert snare drum sticks.
- All rolls should be performed as an orchestral buzz roll.
- Consider different playing zones to help exaggerate dynamics.

Performance Tips:

Snare Drum Technical Etude

- Pay attention to the tempo marking. It stays the same for both snare and tambourine etudes.
- All rolls should be performed as double stroke rolls.
- Listen for consistency in your double strokes no matter the length of the roll.
- Keep flams open and consistent.
- Consider different playing zones to help exaggerate dynamics.
- As soon as you finish the snare solo, be sure to keep counting and slide over to the tambourine.

Tambourine Etude

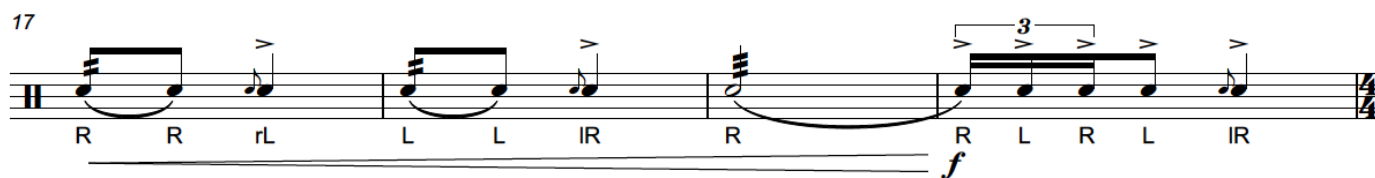
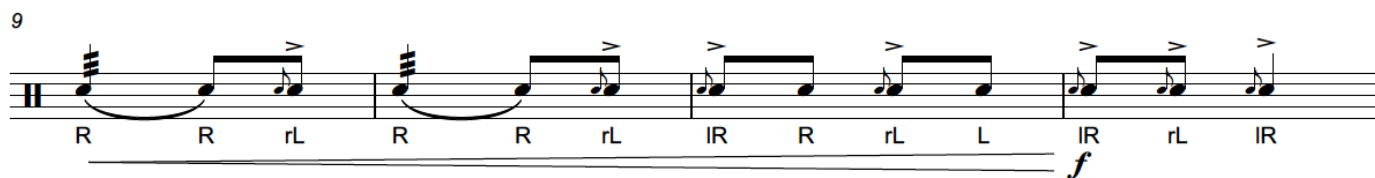
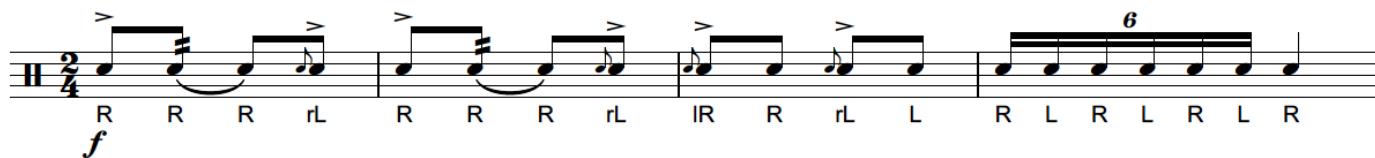
- While counting, quietly put down your sticks and gently pick up the tambourine.
- Begin playing the tambourine etude after your 16 counts of rest are up
- Hold tambourine at a slight angle to lessen the amount of jingle.
- When playing piano, use your finger tips on the edge.
- When playing forte, make a fist and strike the center of the tambourine with knuckles.
- When doing a crescendo, start at edge with finger tips then begin to transfer from finger tips to fist while moving to center.
- Be sure to start tambourine rolls by striking it.
- A “shake roll” should be used for this etude.
