DUNCAN ACQUIRES DORICH—ADDS MUSIC

Effective February 1, 1966, the Duncan Music Company, Inc., of Winston-Salem (sponsors of the DATA page of the EDUCATOR) purchased the Dorich Music Company of the same city. The latter firm had established itself as a leading source of music for school bands, orchestras, and glee clubs, church choirs, and piano and organ teachers and students in the Winston-Salem area during the past five years.
